

What's happening at Chester Zoo.

World's largest rodent gives birth at Chester Zoo



- Playful capybara pup arrived to 'celebrity' mum Lily
- Capybaras can grow up to 1.5m (4.9ft) in length
- Astonished onlookers witnessed the birth and the pup's first swim!
- In the wild, capybara are threatened by poaching and habitat loss

Lily the capybara is a new mum! Her baby could eventually grow to be 1.5m in length – making the capybara the largest species of rodent in the world

The world's largest rodent species has given birth at Chester Zoo.

Six-year-old mum Lily, who has become a real hit with zoo visitors since she was featured on the Channel 4 TV series The Secret Life of the Zoo, delivered her new pup in front of astonished onlookers.

The tiny youngster, who has not yet been sexed, was soon up on its feet and seen running around, climbing over mum and taking its first swim.











Capybaras are often referred to as giant guinea pigs and can grow to up to 1.5m (4.9ft) in length – roughly the size of Kylie Minogue!

They are found living in small herds on grasslands, in tropical forests and on wetlands across much of South America where they spend much of their time in water.

Their scientific name means 'water pig', and their bodies have been specially adapted for swimming - with webbed feet and their eyes, ears and nostrils located on top of their heads.

Although not currently listed as an endangered species, the capybara is threatened by illegal poaching for its meat and skin, which can be turned into leather, as

well as habitat degradation. Keepers at the zoo hope that Lily's new arrival will help to bring some attention to the species, which they say is often overlooked.

Capybara facts

- The capybara is the largest of the world's rodent species
- Their eyes and nostrils are on the tops of their heads so they can stay submerged with very little of their body showing - helping them to avoid detection by predators such as jaguars, anacondas and caiman
- Like rabbits, they eat their own dung to extract maximum nutrition from their food
- The scientific name for the capybara means 'water hog'
- Mum Lily was born on 30 June 2010





Bee Creative in the Garden!

The Royal Horticultural Society and The Wildlife Trusts have joined forces to urge gardeners to do more to help protect bumblebees and solitary bees - heroes of the pollinator world - through their new 'Bee Creative in the Garden!' campaign. Cheshire Wildlife Trust is working locally with communities to promote the importance of Cheshire's bees, through its 'Wildlife Friendly Garden Awards' scheme, and its new Wildlife Garden at Bickley Hall Farm.

The call comes as a result of pressure bees face, following the loss of habitats. In the countryside, 97% of lowland meadow has already been lost and the network of 15 million gardens, that once formed 'green corridors' for wildlife, is rapidly disappearing. The number of front gardens that have been paved over has tripled in a decade, with over five million having no plant life at all.

At Cheshire Wildlife Trust's headquarters, Bickley Hall Farm, a new garden area is being developed using funds from the Tesco 'Bags of Help' scheme. The Wildlife Garden will have fruit trees and vegetable beds, nectar rich flowers and bee hives, as well as a polytunnel to keep the plants happy come rain or shine.

"We will be using this garden for visiting school children, so that they can learn about bees' and pollinators' roles in fruit and vegetable growing," said Nick Rowles, People and Wildlife Officer at Cheshire Wildlife Trust.

"Many children don't know where food comes from and they lack basic gardening skills. We want to do something about this. Food and farming sessions at Bickley will allow children to learn not only about growing food, but they will also have opportunities to cook and taste some of the garden produce too. In the long term, we hope that the garden will become a care farm and centre of horticultural therapy, run by and for adults with learning difficulties, alongside other volunteers."

Cheshire Wildlife Trust is also empowering residents to look after bees through its 'Wildlife Friendly Gardening Award' scheme. The scheme is open to everyone. It doesn't matter how big or small the outdoor space, as long as it is possible to showcase what has been done to help wildlife. This might be through creating a mini wildflower meadow, avoiding chemical weed killers or building insect hotels. Entries to the scheme receive a plague, certificate, gardening booklet and a wildlife spotter's card.

The Royal Horticultural Society and The Wildlife Trusts will be arming gardeners with the advice, insights and inspiration they need to create habitats ready for the spring. These will support wild bees as they emerge from their nests to forage for food. A wild bee-friendly gardening guide is free to download from wildaboutgardensweek.org.uk.

Wildlife events and a 'Bee Creative' photo competition will also take place from 1st April to 1st November 2017, as bees buzz during the gardener's growing season before looking for nesting sites in the autumn. Cheshire's best young artists crowned at Mid Cheshire College







Two budding young artists are celebrating after battling it out with more than 300 pupils from schools across Cheshire to be named the area's best young artists.

Brigid Keighran, a Year 9 student from St Nicholas Catholic High School and Milo Forster Year 5 student from Kelsall Primary School, were crowned the overall winners of the dotart Schools competition at a special prize-giving ceremony at Mid Cheshire College on Wednesday 7th June.


The runners up in the secondary category were Abbie, Holly, Jen, Eve and Maks from the Bishops Bluecoat CofE High School for their group sculpture of a Chinese Dragon; and Hannah Britton of Bridgewater High School for her detailed mixed media Harry Potter artwork. The primary category runners up were Alex Harrison of Green Lane Special School for a mixed media work titled Alex and Louis Cahill of Delamere Primary School for his charcoal drawing of a

Leopard. The two runners up in both categories were also presented with prizes including art materials and tickets to Tate Liverpool's summer exhibition.

Brigid's winning piece titled Ganesha, an elephant created with plaster and paint; and Milo's pen and ink drawing of a Barn Owl both feature alongside the other shortlisted artworks, in the first Cheshire exhibition in the dot-art Schools competition's history.

dot-art Schools is already a well-established fixture in the academic calendar for many Mersevside schools; since its inception almost 4000 students from over 200 schools have taken part. This is the fifth year it will take place in the Liverpool City Region and due to its success and a new partnership with Liverpool John Moores University, a pilot scheme covering Cheshire West & Chester, Cheshire East and Warrington was launched this year.





Komantic Naples, just two hours south of Rome, is the largest city in southern Italy. Naples has very good public transportation and lots of traffic problems so it's best to avoid having a car. The city has a large but crowded bus network, trams, a subway, funiculars, and a suburban train line, the Ferrovia Circumvesuviana, that will get you to Herculaneum, Pompeii, and Sorrento.

Pizza, one of Italy's most famous foods, originated in Naples and pizza is taken very seriously here. You'll find lots of great pizza places but be sure you look for one with a wood-burning oven!

Eggplant Parmesan originated in Naples and spaghetti also became popular in Naples, try it with clams or mussels. Seafood is abundant and very good in Naples.

Naples gets quite hot in summer so spring and fall are probably the best times to visit. Since Naples is near the coast, it's more temperate in winter than interior cities of Italy.

As you are only in Naples for 1 whole day from the ship, enjoy the other great places such as your stay in Barcelona.

See the best of Barcelona on a private sightseeing tour, which offers a comprehensive view of this exquisite Catalan city and includes skip-the-line access at La Sagrada Familia, a popular attraction that often has long lines. ne weatner is warm and school is out, but learning experiences shouldn't end there. The summer months can provide plenty of opportunities to continue a child's advancement through different activities and programs.

According to recent studies, students can lose up to three months of what they learned during the school year over summer break. To help avoid that loss of knowledge, here are some helpful brain-boosting activities to keep your child's mind sharp this summer.

Super summer camps

Schedule some time outside when the view is at its best, such as early in the morning when birds are singing or just before dusk as the sun sets over the horizon.



oreview by Tony Yates Keeping you motoring

F-Pace - R-Sport 2.0d 180PS AWD



At first you might look at the all new F-Pace and think OK, it's just another SUV that looks just like all the others currently on the market - so, why should I bother looking any further.

Well - I have a few good reasons why you should; firstly it's actually a very good looking SUV and secondly - it's built by Jaguar, and Jaguar at the moment are producing some of the world's greatest cars. And thirdly, the F-Pace is much better than anything that the German firms have come up with recently.

Design & Technology:

Let's start with the looks of the F-Pace - it looks amazing and far better looking than an Audi Q7 or a BMW X5 for that matter. Also, both of German offerings look terrible on the inside and look like they were designed in a studio with either all the lights turned out - or by a person who has literally no concept of the term 'ergonomics'.

So, there you go; The F-Pace R-Sport has everything you will ever need on the inside, along with its distinctive body line, bold front bumpers, large air intakes, chrome radiator surround, side power vents and wheels that are the size of the Moon (in a good way)

Cheshire Ride 2017 for Life NoW Sunday September 3rd 2017

This charity cycle sportive was first organised last year, and was very well received by all those who entered. It is not a race, but challenges you to ride either 70 miles or 45 miles on the minor roads and lanes of West Cheshire. The route is fully waymarked, and we have a midway feed station (including flapjack and cake!) and free refreshments at the start/ finish. Our start and finish this year is Upton Pavilion, Whealstone Lane. Upton. Chester CH2 1HB.

The ride is approved and supported by British Cycling, and entry is via their web site. You do not need to be a member of British Cycling or any cycling club or organisation. We have a chip card registration and timing system, and each rider receives a commemorative gift. Under 18s can enter but will need to complete a parental consent form, and under 16s must be accompanied on the ride by a parent or quardian.

Life NoW is a charity aiming to provide palliative care and support for young adults with life limiting conditions in the North West and North Wales. There is currently only one other facility specifically for young adults in the UK, and that is in Oxfordshire.

The event is run entirely by unpaid volunteer supporters of Life NoW. The entry fee is £20.

JUST WATER THIRSTY PLANTS

No rain? Target precious water at the plants that really need it



Feed hungry roses
Roses are very hungry plants and will need a feeding with a granular rose fertiliser now to ensure they continue flowering all summer and into autumn and even beyond.

- Deadhead spent blooms It used to be recommended to cut back the flowering stems by around 10-15cm (4-6in) but it's far better to simply and carefully snap off the faded flower and seedpod between thumb and forefinaer.
- Check for mildew In warm, dry weather, roses are prone to powdery mildew. If you see the first signs of this disease (a white powdery coating on leaves), or rose blackspot or rust, spray the foliage with a systemic fungicide. A combined insecticide and fungicide will also help to control aphid and other pest outbreaks



Unless we have a prolonged, very dry period, it might not be necessary to water well-established garden plants at all – certainly your lawn will be quick to recover from drought as soon as it rains. Watering little and often, only applying a small amount of water that doesn't penetrate deep into the soil, will encourage surface rooting that makes the plants more susceptible to drought and drying out.

Once a day

Plants in containers, especially hanging baskets, will probably need a good watering every day to keep the compost evenly moist and prevent it drying out.

Once a week

All recent plantings, especially bedding plants, will appreciate a good soak every seven to 14 days to aid rapid establishment, good growth and flowering performance.

Once a fortnight

Rhododendrons, camellias, hydrangeas and other shallow-rooted plants might appreciate a good soak now and then. Rhododendrons and camellias will be setting their flower buds for next year so allowing them to dry out will prevent good bud set.

While you're on holiday

If you're going away this summer, ensure that your plants feature in your holiday plans. Group container plants in shade and if you can't persuade a neighbour to look after them while you're away, you could consider setting up an automatic dripwatering system.

Capillary matting is good for selfwatering pots both in the greenhouse and in the house. Houseplants should be removed from sunny windowsills and placed on damp capillary matting in the sink or bath.



Weatherwatch

Lots of warm, sunny weather means all your plants will be growing well - but so will the weeds. You'll also be building up your muscles carrying heavy watering cans around! The sun's drying effect can be exacerbated by wind, so check plants - especially those in containers and hanging baskets - for drying out during windy days.




