





What's happening at Chester Zoo.

Conservationists at Chester Zoo are calling on members of the public to help save swifts.

- Conservationists call for public to help save much loved bird species
- Swifts have lived alongside people in towns and cities since Roman times
- Yet species has now declined by around 50%
- First major swift survey in the area for 20 years underway
- Chester Zoo offering public tips on how to help
- Remarkable birds are known to eat, sleep and mate in flight
- Species can stay airborne for four years, only landing to lay eggs
- Chester Swift Conservation Group fighting to protect the species

The swift – a bird which can fly non-stop for four years; eats, sleeps and mates without landing, and has shared our towns and cities since Roman times – is in rapid decline and needs public help to survive. Conservationists in Chester are now calling on members of the public to help survey the species



and create new nest sites for this much loved species.

Experts are offering tips on how to lend a helping hand to this British favourite by protecting nest sites and putting up nest boxes.

Meanwhile the first major swift survey in the Chester area for 20 years is underway.

The swift is one of the UK's most iconic species. It migrates from Africa up through Europe every spring to nest in the UK over summer.

Yet after the long journey, the much loved birds are arriving in the UK to find a lack of nesting sites.

Historically swifts nested in holes in trees and rocky crevices. However since Roman times they have made use of the eaves and holes of buildings, so

much so they now rarely nest anywhere else. But improvements to buildings in the UK in recent decades have led to a shortage of homes for swifts.

The problem is a major threat to the future of the one of nature's greatest fliers. There are thought to be only around half as many swifts in the UK as there were 20 years ago.

The species, which has always been one of the most visible natural sights of the British summer, is now amber-listed on the list of Birds of Conservation Concern.

Conservationists from Chester Zoo's Wildlife Connections campaign and the Chester RSPB Group have teamed up with Chester and Cheshire West Council (CWAC), RECORD, Cheshire Wildlife Trust, the Cheshire biological records centre and local experts in a bid to help the bird by turning Chester into a swift friendly city.

Manon Keir, Wildlife Connections project officer at Chester Zoo, said:

"The great British summer would not be the same without the sight and sounds of swifts gracing our skies, but we mustn't take this for granted. Conservation is critical but it is certainly not too late.

"Every one of us can make a difference. There is a simple video guide on the Chester Zoo website demonstrating how to make a swift nest box for your garden. And the RSPB Chester Group are recruiting volunteers for the 2017 swift survey. It's time to act for wildlife together."

The swift is plain brown bird with a distinctive crescent shape, long wings and a short forked tail, perfectly designed for their long journeys.

They move in groups and are one of nature's most impressive fliers, staying airborne from fledging until they breed for the first time four years later. They can fly more than 500 miles per day during the nesting season as they travel north to the UK. Roger Nutter from RSPB Chester Group, said:

"In summer 2016, more than 200 records were submitted in the first phase of the Chester Swift

Survey. We hope that even more people will take part in 2017. Volunteers who would like to help with the survey should contact Chester RSPB Group through www.rspb.org.uk/groups/chester."



There are certain times when I question my choice of weekend leisure activities. One wet Club walk in North Wales earlier this summer was one such occasion. We had parked at Garth Mill, at Ffynnongroyw near Holywell, for an 8 mile trek in an area I'd not previously visited. The building itself ceased to operate as a mill in 1956, fell into disuse and was eventually renovated and turned into a pub. It still provides a welcome sight for tired hikers returning to base after a walk along the nearby Wales Coastal Path. The particular day of our visit, the mill stream gushed feroclously past the car park, transporting two days' worth of rainwater down to the Dee Estuary a short distance away. The skies still looked ominously grim, but the weather forecast had promised improvements....

Our route took us up through attractive woodland, eventually leaving the Coastal Path to head inland on field footpaths criss-crossed with unharvested (and very wet) knee-high hay and barley. Very soon we were drenched. We must have been a sorry sight - sixteen of us, clad from head to boot in the latest rainproof walking gear that struggled do what it said on the tin. The cows and horses we passed as we squelched through their soggy but verdant pastures thought we were barmy. One horse stopped chewing grass to stare at us for a few moments, looked round at his mates grazing in the corner as if to say 'Hey, guys, just come and look at this daft lot!' Five or six of them immediately trotted over, half-chewed grass still dangling from their laws, and stood gaping at us with amazement over the fence as we passed by. I'd swear they were sniggering. Elsewhere, a herd of young bullocks spotted us climbing the stile into the field next to theirs, aleefully lined up along the wire barrier fence and watched with delight as we sopping wet hikers bog-hopped past them. Judging by the amused look on every single bovine face, we really made their day.

On that particular walk, the rain eventually reduced to a light drizzle, and even stopped every now and again, but the views were still denied us. The vantage point from which we should have seen Snowdonia to the west, and the Wirral across the estuary to the north, offered us only low grey clouds and damp mist. Lunch under a dripping tree had us all doubting the worthiness of our decision to be out in the hills that particular Sunday, when our friends, family and colleagues were, no doubt, enjoying a hot, tasty dinner with a roof over their heads.

We are often asked if we walk in all weathers, and the answer is a resounding 'Yes'! Occasionally, club leaders cancel a walk for safety reasons – stormy winds, flooding or heavy snowfalls can pose serious dangers to walkers, however well-equipped they are. However, there are always takers for a walk, even on a dire day. Whatever the weather forecast, a wet Sunday

morning rarely heralds rain 24/7 and there's usually a change for the better at some time during the day. My other half is an optimist in these situations, quick to spot that minuscule break in the clouds that no-one else can see. 'Looks like it's brightening up over there' is his much-used catchphrase. I always find it strangely invigorating to be outdoors, though, even when it's is a tad on the moist side. Whatever plus points you can drag from a wet walk in the hills, there is a deep and underlying philanthropic sense of satisfaction when you've provided an entertaining floor show for bored farm animals!

The British weather is nothing if not varied. Gallingly, on the Sunday following the Garth Mill walk, there was wall-to-wall sunshine and the temperatures soared.



Ito Review by Tony Yates Keeping you motoring

Isuzu D-Max Arctic Truck AT35



For this week's review - I have decided to do a bit of Arctic Exploring - because the car I am testing is the Isuzu D-Max Arctic pick-up truck which is a vehicle festooned with large wheels, Botox bodywork and an engine that would if required, move the Polar Ice-Caps.

So, to keep things simple, I will refrain from going to the North or South Pole and instead drive a truck that was designed to work in an extreme environment around the county of Staffordshire while blocking all the roads and causing total havoc as I try to park something the size of a 747 in a little town called Uttoxeter.

Power and Efficiency

The D-Max is powered by a 2.5 litre twin turbo diesel engine that has 160PS and 400Nm of torque. I won't go into too much detail regarding performance – as the D-Max is not about performance – it's about being a workhorse. But for those of you who want to know; Max speed comes in around 111mph and on the combined cycle - I was able to achieve 38mpg.

On the Road

Here, I think we should focus mainly on the D-Max's off-road abilities – so I shall start with that. I have a friend who owns a farm – and he had kindly let me use some of its muddy paths to see how it would fair compared to his Land Rover. Well, I have to say – the D-Max was pretty faultless really. But then again, that's mainly thanks to those large wheels which help improve the ride height massively. That raised ride height also means it will pretty much clamber over anything in its path.

Also, I always take a pre set route that can sometimes take me up to 200miles away from my starting point which is a good test to find out how the vehicle faired on normal roads as well as motorways. Well, I am happy to say it did a great job, apart from those

massive tyres' which do seem to make a lot of road noise. But, to be fair, the D-Max was actually a decent ride on normal roads. Although, the suspension was quite firm – but then I suppose it has to be because of what the D-Max was originally designed to do.

Design and Technology

Inside was also kitted out very well, and here are some of the features you can expect to get as standard on the 'Arctic version' including; ABS + ESC, front, side & curtain airbags, height-adjustable front seatbelts, security-etched glass, Insurance-approved immobiliser, remote central locking, rear parking distance sensors, RDS radio/single CD with iPod®/USB/Bluetooth® connectivity, Six speakers which include 2 'Exciter' roof mounted speakers. Along with heated front screen, seats, steering wheel audio controls, cruise control and a Premium Black Leather Interior.

To Sum Up

I really was impressed by the D-Max, yes it may look like a pick-up on Botox -but I'm telling you now - the D-Max is a decent buy.



Gardening To Do List - October in the Garden

Gardening in October is entirely dependent on the weather. If there's an Indian Summer, there is no better time of year to be out in the garden. While gardeners in warm areas will have more to do than their northern counterparts, there are plenty of garden tasks to keep everyone busy in October.

Tidy Borders

Keep on weeding and have a gentle tidy up in your borders but do try to resist the temptation of a thorough spring clean. Leave seedheads for the birds if you don't want to collect them and as much cover as you can bear for wildlife who will appreciate the winter shelter.

Fallen leaves can be left to rot down (or collected for leaf mould) however diseased material is another matter; make it a priority to clea and burn it to prevent pests and diseases overwintering courtesy or your kind hospitality! Put the rest of your garden rubbish (apart from woody stems) in the compost.



Start your compost

If you haven't already done so, start your compost going by buying a bin or building a partially enclosed area for a heap. It is vital to replace the goodness in soil after a hefty growing season and autumn produces masses of garden waste that will put invaluable organic richness back into the ground for next spring.

Add a variety of different materials; spent vegetable and bedding plants, herbaceous leftovers, thatch, moss and cuttings from the lawn, weeds (but not the roots unless they have been through a shredder), hedge clippings, kitchen peelings and tea bags are ideal.

Prepare your soil for next year

Your soil is your most precious commodity, so start digging in compost, manure and as much organic matter as you can lay your hands on to replace the goodness in it. Healthy soil is the basis of healthy plants and a healthy environment. When garden soil is in good shape there is less need for fertilizers or pesticides.

The earlier you start the better, especially if your soil is heavy. It can be left in a pretty rough state over the winter when the elements will break the clods down, making spring planting infinitely easier! Proper pH is also an essential characteristic of healthy soil.



Rake fallen leaves

Don't waste fallen leaves (except those perilous rose leaves and evergreens, which take too long to rot down) - given time they decompose into fabulously rich leaf mould - aka 'nature's soil conditioner of choice'! Rake up fallen leaves and chuck them into a simple frame to make leaf mould (black bin liners spiked with air holes will also do if you can bear the visual offense - but remember to dampen the leaves first). If left to linger on the lawn for long, the grass will turn yellow. Leaf mould takes about a year to mature, a great top dressing for woodland plants such as rhododendrons and is an excellent and FREE home-grown substitute for peat.

Chester Urban Wildlife Group have much to celebrate this year with the creation of a new wildflower meadow in Chester City Centre.

Working in partnership with Alexanders Live café-bar in Rufus Court, the Chester Urban Wildlife Group have turned a neglected area of grassland at the back of the bar into a dazzling display of cornflowers, corncockle and corn marigold. Species-rich meadows were once found across much of lowland England, but since the 1940's intensive agriculture has destroyed about 97% of this precious habitat. The remaining 8,000 hectares depend on sympathetic management such as low-intensity grazing by livestock or mowing for hay.

The Chester Urban Wildlife Group is keen to work with landowners in Chester City Centre to transform unused green spaces into colourful, vibrant meadows that help conserve wildlife and promote sustainable land management practices.

A raised wildflower bed has also been installed on the site, thanks to the support of the composite decking firm Ecodek in Wrexham. The raised bed contains a variety of native grasses and wildflowers such as Viper's bugloss which will encourage pollinating insects such as bees and butterflies. We can all help biodiversity in our towns and cities, either by leaving areas of unmown grass for mammals and birds, or planting native wildflowers in pots or hanging baskets.
