COMPANY BOSS RUNS FIRST CHESTER MARATHON AND RAISES ALMOST £9,000 IN MEMORY OF 'BEAUTIFUL' SCARLETT



A COMPANY boss has run his first Chester marathon and raised almost £9,000 in memory of a 'beautiful' young woman who died suddenly from a rare condition.

Paul Hollingsworth took part in the Chester Marathon the other month and has now more than doubled his original £4,000

fundraising target in aid of Ataxia UK.

He ran the 26-mile race and fundraised the money to remember Scarlett Salisbury, the daughter of his close friend Jeremy, who died in March, just days after celebrating her 21st birthday with family and friends, including Paul and his wife Suzanne.

Scarlett, of Colwyn Bay, was diagnosed with Friedreich's Ataxia when she was eight, which is the most common form of Ataxia - the name given to a group of neurological disorders which affect balance, coordination and speech.

The former Rydal Penrhos pupil, who never let her condition dictate her life, was weeks away from gaining a degree in Media Studies at Bangor University when she died at Glan Clwyd Hospital from heart problems associated with her condition.

Paul, 54, managing director of Hollingsworth Group in Sandycroft, said: "Scarlett, or Scally as we called her, was an absolutely beautiful girl and so full of happiness and life. "Running a marathon is not easy, but at the points where I found it hard, I only had to think of Scarlett and what her family, our very good friends, are going through and I used that as a driver when it got difficult."

Paul, of Gorsedd, near Holywell, who is dad to Gemma, 28, Barney, 24, Louie, 12, and Lottie, five, added: "I am immensely proud of the amount of money raised and really touched by the generosity of all the sponsors. There were more than 100 donors. I can't quite believe the amount they have helped me raise and it will be great to hand this over to Ataxia UK so they can continue their work supporting other families in the same situation and trying to find a cure.

"I would like to sincerely thank all who have donated to date whether it be large companies who donated £500, to unknown individuals who donated £5. Every donation counts and has helped me to raise this brilliant amount."

Scarlett's family, dad Jeremy, mum Lowri, and older brother Henry, 24, were there waiting to congratulate Paul as he crossed the finishing line.

Jeremy, who is the Director of Salisburys Chartered Accountants based in St Asaph, said: "We are all thrilled at Paul's achievement and the fantastic sum of money he has been able to raise in Scarlett's memory which will go towards helping others dealing with Ataxia and the devastation it causes.

"These moments are hard for us. It brings our loss back into focus but it also helps because we know Scarlett is not forgotten and was looked upon so fondly by people, like our friend Paul, who put themselves out and do these tough challenges.

"We loved Scarlett so very dearly and it is with great pride that we hear and are part of all these things that people are doing in her name.

"They are crucial to raising awareness of Ataxia which is very important to us because we have to keep the momentum up so work will be done and funds will be raised to eventually break through and find a cure.

"Sadly this will all come too late for our beautiful girl but it may eventually stop other families having to live with the deep sadness which we accept will never go away."

Paul completed the marathon in four hours and 45 minutes, and said: "The atmosphere was incredible and I am really glad to have taken part.

"It has felt like a real personal achievement and I am determined to have another go at one before too long. The training is a lot of hard work but it has definitely not put me off and it was all worth it, coming over the finishing line, knowing I had got round and knowing I had raised all the money for Ataxia UK."

CEO of Ataxia UK, Sue Millman, said: It's amazing how people rise to new challenges when given the opportunity to do something to benefit the ataxia community in memory of a friend or relative.

"This brilliant work will ultimately contribute to success in finding treatments and cures for all of the ataxias."

Whatever the weather



D'you walk whatever the weather? This question is often asked when our favourite weekend activity crops up in conversation. The answer is 'Usually, yes', though there are occasions when even the hardiest of us baulk at facing torrential showers, strong winds or below freezing temperatures. Within Chester Rambling and Hill Walking Club, walks are sometimes cancelled if snow or gale force winds are likely to endanger members.

Those of us who lead walks for the Club are mindful of ensuring a safe and enjoyable countryside experience when planning routes. One recent hike that my other half and I led at Llanarmonvn-ial we had previously tried and tested several times, though not for a few years, and never in winter. This is a favourite walking area of ours, with views of the Clwydian Range, the Llantisilios and, on a good day, the Berwyns, A reconnoitring trip is always necessary, as things change over time - paths become overgrown, signage vanishes, stiles disintegrate and once pleasant bridleways become paddling pools or, worse, mud baths. All these annovances we encountered on our 'reccy' prior to leading this walk. One track had to be waded through, another involved forgaing through a forest of gorse, one stile was broken and dangerous, and a field recently used for grazing cattle had become a vast sea of thick, treacly mud, laced with cowpats. With dismay, we accepted that the route needed tweaking....

The OS map for this area indicates a myriad of dotted green lines, and we soon identified a way to cut out the offending obstacles. Trying out the options was interesting. One footpath, clearly rarely used due to the absence of yellow markers, involved some map reading skill and a good nose for direction, but we found it! It took us across an attractive grassy and mud-free field interspersed with limestone outcrops. Over the brow of the hill a beautiful view of the Llantisilios opened up, silhouetted against the winter sky. This track linked up with a well-used path leading down towards the car park at the disused Pistyll Gwyn quarry. Not only had we found ourselves a very lovely new route, we'd managed to cut out the gorse, the paddling pool and one muddy stretch. Then, by substituting a short section of road through the village of Eryrys, we eliminated both the muddy swamp and the dangerous stile.

When we led the walk for the group two weeks later, we left Chester on a dull, frosty morning, and from Mold onwards, freezing mist and low cloud shrouded the hills. Setting off along the footpaths, slippery stiles were a problem and care had to be taken to make sure no-one landed prone on the frozen grass. Across the foggy fields we kept members in sight in front and



behind us, to ensure that no-one strayed off the route and got lost. This is where those colourful coats and hats favoured by walkers come into their own!

By late morning, the sun was spotted through the thinning cloud, and hills began to pop up from above the mist. Having despaired of seeing that beautiful panoramic view from our carefully chosen lunch stop, the timing on the day was impeccable. The Clwyds were lined up in front of us against a backdrop of blue sky, while drifting cloud still hovered over the Alyn Valley below. As we tucked into our cheese butties, we watched entranced, as the last white tufts disappeared westwards towards Ruthin.

The cloudiest, foggiest or wettest mornings can all materialise into a glorious day's walking later. However, the reverse is also true.....

So, do we walk in all weather? Usually, yes.

CHESTER RAMBLING & HILL WALKING CLUB



What's happening at Chester Zoo.

A pride of Asiatic lions – the world's rarest lion species - have taken their first steps into a specially-created new home at Chester Zoo.



The zoo's new conservation area is the UK's largest habitat for Asiatic lions.

The habitat is designed to recreate the environment of the Gir Forest region of India, where the last few hundred Asiatic lions live in the wild.

The zoo hopes a new visitor zone will raise awareness of the threats faced by Asiatic lions in the wild, including human-wildlife conflict, and the conservation action needed to protect the species.

Lionesses Kumari and Kiburi - along with adult male Iblis - have been exploring their sprawling new home. before the space opens to visitors for the first time on Friday (18 October).

Dave Hall, Team Manager of Carnivores at Chester Zoo, said:

"Asiatic lions are impressively built animals, with compact bodies, powerful legs and strong jaws and 14

teeth, making them superb hunters.

"Their retractable claws, which they use for gripping tightly on to prey, can be up to 38mm long and they have rough tongues, like sandpaper, for scraping meat from bones.

"They are truly majestic animals. This brand new habitat at the zoo - the largest in the UK - really is a fitting new home for them."

The area - which has been specially created by the zoo's carnivore experts - spans 4,780 square metres in total.

Recreating the scrubland savannahs of India's Gir Forest region, the dry forest habitat contains raised hilltop viewing points for the pride, as well as heated rocks and a water hole.

The habitat is also complete with heated indoor dens. which zoo experts hope will one day be the perfect

environment for cubs. The state-of-the-art facility could be a major boost to the European breeding programme for the species, which is teetering on the brink of extinction in the wild.

As few as 650 lions are thought to remain in the wild. Poaching, human-wildlife conflict, habitat loss and disease have caused a catastrophic decline in Asiatic lion populations in their natural range.

The last Asiatic lions populations survive in Gujarat, India, in the Gir Forest region, but this is just 0.1% of their former territories. The species once roamed across Northern Africa, Greece, Turkey and Asia but are now confined to one small region of India, where natural disaster or an outbreak of disease could wipe out the entire species.

Local community action, supported by international conservationists, has helped to slowly increase numbers in recent years, but the species remains 'endangered' on the International Union for the Conservation of Nature's (IUCN) 'Red List' of threatened species – meaning it is still faced with a high chance of extinction.

Dr Mark Pilgrim, Chester Zoo's Chief Executive Officer, said:

"This remarkable species is facing a very uncertain future. The European endangered species breeding programme is critically important. If the worst was to happen in the wild, good zoos would be the only thing standing between Asiatic lions and extinction.

"We're very proud to be able to give the Asiatic lion pride the world's best conservation breeding facilities. We also hope the new area will help us raise much needed awareness about the plight of Asiatic lions.

"Lions were among the first carnivores cared for here by Chester Zoo's founder George Mottershead. He was a pioneering animal welfare advocate, who realised his vision for the first 'zoo without bars'. Our ongoing habitat creation programme continues to deliver George's 'always building' philosophy, which has pushed the boundaries of world-class animal welfare and conservation in zoos."

The new habitat – which has been created using environmentally considerate construction techniques – has been created using the latest sustainable construction standards. Climate controlled dens, heated by sustainable "green" energy and supported by fully insulated walls and roof, will minimise power consumption in order to create year-round optimum conditions for the big cats.

The Asiatic lion habitat will open to visitors from Friday 18 October. Entry is free, with normal zoo admission. Zoo tickets can be booked via www.chesterzoo.org

Sweet and sour pork



Ingredients:

1/2 lb. pork tenderloin (cut into bite size pieces)
1/2 green bell pepper (2 oz. and cut into pieces)
1/2 red bell pepper (2 oz. and cut into pieces)
2 stalks scallions
(only the white part, cut into 2 inch length)
1 piece fresh/canned pineapple ring
(cut into small pieces)
1 clove garlic (finely chopped)
Oil for frving

Marinate:

1 teaspoon soy sauce 1/2 teaspoon corn starch 1/2 teaspoon rice wine

Sweet and Sour Sauce:

1 1/2 tablespoons tomato ketchup
1 teaspoon plum sauce
1/8 teaspoon Chinese rice vinegar (transparent in color)
1/2 teaspoon Lea & Perrins Worcestershire Sauce
1 teaspoon oyster sauce
1 teaspoon corn starch
1 teaspoon sugar
2 tablespoons water

Frying Batter:

1/2 cup water 2 oz. all-purpose flour 1 oz. corn starch 1/2 teaspoon baking soda

1/2 egg

1 teaspoon cooking oil 1 small pinch of salt



Method:

Cut the pork tenderloin into pieces and marinate with the ingredients for 15-20 minutes.

Mix the sweet and sour sauce ingredients well and set aside.

Strain the dry ingredients of the frying batter and then add in the egg, water, and cooking oil to form a thick batter.

When the pork is well-marinated, transfer the pork pieces into the batter and make sure they are well coated. In a deep skillet, add in the cooking oil enough for deep-frying. Once the oil is hot, deep fry the pork pieces until they turn golden brown. Dish out and drain on paper towels.

Heat up a wok and add in some cooking oil. Add in the chopped garlic and stir fry until light brown, then follow by the bell peppers and pineapple pieces. Stir fry until you smell the peppery aroma from the peppers and then add in the sweet and sour sauce. As soon as the sauce thickenens, transfer the pork into the wok and stir well with the sauce. Add in the chopped scallions, do a few quick stirs, dish out and serve hot with steamed white rice.



Create your own Nectar-rich flowers and creature features will make

your garden a magnet for wildlife

nce upon a time the 'wildlife The good news is, times have garden' was something that got tucked away at the bottom of the garden. The fear was that it would look a bit scruffy and spoil the general outlook - and besides, the rest of the garden was needed for other activities such as growing vegetables and displaying prized dahlias.

GREEN UP YOUR PATIO

Hard landscaping seldom offers much wildlife interest, bar a bit of lichen on the paving slabs or algae on the decking! To give your nature trail a better start, findaway to incorporate a container of pollinator-friendly wildflowers, or perhaps a bee brick, bug hotel or stook of short garden canes or hollow stems to encourage lacewings and ladybirds tohibernate.

That climber growing up the housewall is the ideal place for robins tonest each year, and perhaps adding a nestbox will encourage sparrows to move in?

2) PLANT NECTAR-RICH BLOOMS

Flowerbeds are usually full of spring bulbs and summer flowers. In nature. this is like an open ungrazed habitat, bathed in sunlight, where flowers grow tall.

The obvious visitors are bees and hoverflies; if we're lucky, we'll see some butterflies, too. Stop, stoop and look hard - you'll see that all that foliage provides cover and homes for many other insects, spiders and other creepy crawlies too.

Butterflies and bees will really be boosted if you choose only those plants that are stuffed with nectar and pollen. Too many cultivated plants have lost all their goodness, so avoid double flowers (whose stamens have been bred into extrapetals) and your borders will soon be buzzing.

moved on and today gardeners have realised that wildlife-friendly features can be incorporated everywhere. With just a little bit of thought, your garden can be good for you and for the planet. Some of the best gardens for nature are some of the most beautiful. So why not create your own nature trail?

Small garde changes can bring stunning visitors.

HABITATS Bird boxes, bug hotels and hoggy homes should be positioned in a safe, sheltered place away from daily human activity.

3 BUILD A POND

A garden pond might not have the wild swans and geese of the great wetlands and marshes but, wherever there is water, life will come. For many of us the highlight will be frogs and newts. If you're really lucky you'll attract toads. But evenwatching the skimming of pondskaters across the surface or the antics under the surface of water-boatmen is entertainment enough.

Even an ornamental pond will still attract colourful dragonflies and damselflies, and birdswill visit to drink and bathe.

The larger your pond, the more wildlife it's likely to support. Ponds that have shallow margins and plenty of submerged native pondweed and emergent plants will be much better than steep-sided, plant-free ponds. The water weed and some pond snails will help keep the water clear.

25 CREATE LEAFY COVER



Climbing plants such as honeysuckle, clematis and evergreen ivy are ideal for turning bare fences into wildlife-rich habitat. Not only do they offer plenty of shelter for nesting birds and insects, but the flowers will offer nectar and pollen, and berries in late summer.

For me, the XCeed is one of the most comprehensively equipped models in the Ceed family. The new XCeed has an extensive package of comfort, convenience, connectivity and safety, which is why I like the new XCeed so much. This car makes a statement about the person you are. It also makes you feel happy when you drive it, and it makes you feel happy when you remember you have the assurance of the Kia brand right by your side. This alone will ensure you have many happy years of motoring.

Power and Efficiency:

The XCeed I had on test was powered by a 998cc 3 cylinder petrol engine that develops 118bhp and 172 Nm of torque which I have to say feels lively and is more than happy to blast down the motorway or rumble around on the urban towns. Actually, the XCeed exceeded all my expectations when it came to helping me save fuel and make my normal boring school run just that little bit easier. The XCeed also achieved 50 mpg on the combined cycle which was quite impressive. Maximum speed also comes in at around115mph, followed by a 0-62 time of 10.9s.

On the road:

Well, if I'm honest with you – I expected it to be good, and I wasn't disappointed. The ride height is just about right, as is the suspension setup. Kia always seems to get it just about right most of the time – and, I felt the ride quality in the XCeed was everything I wanted it to be. Now, for some, they might consider the ride to be a little on the 'firm' side – but to me, it felt sturdy and poised. No dramas to talk about, just a fantastic amount of grip in and out of every corner. Plus if you go in a little heavy, you can be assured the XCeed will keep you firmly planted to the tarmac ahead.

Design & Technology

On the inside, the interior is very good, and all the dials are easy to read. Plus all the vehicle controls are well set out. The seats are comfy and there was a nice finish to the interior. Yes, it's not perfect in some areas, but show me a car that gets everything right, and I will quit writing altogether. Plus I actually don't care if the plastic is a little rough to the touch - because for me it's about the package as a whole - and what the XCeed can offer the modern driver.

Plus, you do get some pretty decent equipment such as; cruise control with speed limiter, air conditioning, alarm system, electric windows all-round, keyless entry, automatic headlight control, LED bi-function projection headlights, LED daytime running lights, DAB radio, Bluetooth and an 8" audio display touchscreen system offering Android Auto & Apple CarPlay.

Plus; Vehicle Stability Management. This aids stability when braking and cornering by controlling the car's Electronic Stability Control if it detects a loss of traction. Then there are; six airbags, Land Keeping Assist, High Beam Assist, Hill Start Assist Control and Forward Collision-Avoidance Assist all included as standard.

To sum up:

I'm going to give the Kia XCeed four stars in this test, not only because I like how it looks on the outside, but also because Kia gives you big smiles for very little money.

CODE NATION FREE TRAINING COURSES CHANGING LIVES FOR CHESTER UNEMPLOYED

Chester-based digital training specialist, Code Nation are offering free courses to Chester's unemployed, thanks to government funding. "I threw myself into the 3 week 'Develop' course at Code Nation, and I grasped a real understanding for coding and thoroughly enjoyed my time there.

"My journey didn't end there though – I was absolutely thrilled to receive a scholarship at the Code Nation Chester campus on the 'Master' course. Not only did my knowledge of coding grow tenfold, the team found me a job and I've been hired as a Junior Developer by a business in Crewe – it's amazing!

It's not been the easiest of journeys, but this is definitely a fabulous new start and I intend to embrace every moment."
