What's Appening at Chester Zoo.

Baby otters begin 'swimming lessons' at Chester Zoo

Five Asian short-clawed otter pups begin swimming lessons during their first outdoor adventure

• FIVE Asian short-clawed otter pups venture outside for the very first time... and start to dip their tiny toes in water!

- Adorable pups begin to get their paws wet as mum Annie and dad Wallace teach them how to swim
- Asian short-clawed otters are the world's SMALLEST species of otter
- The new quintet, made up of three girls and two boys, are yet to be named
- The species is threatened by habitat loss and hunting for their skins and organs – often used in traditional Chinese medicine 12

Five otter pups have been given their first 'swimming lessons' at Chester Zoo.

After staying snuggled up in their holts with parents Annie and Wallace for a number of weeks since birth, the adorable quintet finally developed the confidence to venture outside for the very time.

Led by mum Annie, the unnamed pups – three girls and two boys – began to dip their tiny toes in their pool and splashed around the water's edge.

Otter experts at the zoo say the pups all still sport their baby fur which is not yet fully waterproofed, but the new arrivals will soon build up the courage to fully submerge themselves in water.

Asian short-clawed otters are the world's smallest species of otter, and the new born pups are currently weigh around just 500 grams.

Hannah Owens, Assistant Team Manager at the zoo, said:

"Seeing the pups taking their first steps outside and dipping their paws into the water is wonderful. The pups are gaining confidence all the time and it's great to see each of their little personalities starting to shine through. Annie and Wallace are experienced parents so, with some gentle encouragement, the pups will soon be gliding through the water in no time. For the time being though, until their waterproof coats are fully developed, they're just dipping their toes in and getting used to being close to water.

"Asian short-clawed otters have evolved to be great swimmers. They have webbed feet, develop thick fur coats which are densely packed and water repellent, boast a powerful rudder-like tail that propels them through the water and they can close their ears and nostrils while swimming – they are the ultimate aquatic animals!"

Listed as vulnerable to extinction by the International Conservation of Nature (IUCN), Asian short-clawed otters are the smallest of all 13 otter species and face increasing threats in the wild of South East Asia. The tiny mammals are hunted for their skins and organs, which are often used in traditional Chinese medicine. Their wetland habitats have also been overfished by humans and used for logging and farmland.

The zoo has previously helped fund research and conservation projects in Cheshire which are monitoring and safeguarding threatened UK otter populations – distant relatives of the Asian shortclawed species.



Charity to Celebrate 10th Anniversary



For any small charity to have set up and helped hundreds, if not thousands, of people for a decade is no mean feat.

To have done so, and continued to grow and develop, and celebrate its tenth anniversary with bundles of hope and ambition for the future, is even better.

And that is the case with Cheshire Autism Practical Support, or ChAPS, for short.

Jo Garner, Managing Director, first set up ChAPS those ten years ago.

Since then, the charity has supported countless people on the autism spectrum and their families, with the ambition to 'support and educate parents to help your child be the best that they can be'.

The longevity, and the success, has been very much down to a team effort.

"ChAPS has been running now for ten years which I think is an incredible achievement in the current climate," says Jo, who first started the charity to help her own son, who is on the autism spectrum. "It is all down to our team, which is a tightly-knit family unit primarily of staff who are parents themselves of a child or adult with additional needs.

"We all understand the difficulties and issues and celebrate the successes and amazing capability of all of our members.

"One of our patrons – Anna Kennedy OBE – is a hugely inspirational personality and runs Anna Kennedy Online, a national charity helping to increase awareness of autism.

"Anna's extremely successful 'Autism's Got Talent' event has run for nine years now and it celebrates how awesome children and adults on the autism spectrum are in an evening of performances in theatres up and down the country.

"Anna will be bringing her roadshow to Cheshire in May and we are so excited that she will be up North to present her very special evening of entertainment for ChAPS as we celebrate ten years." Anna says: *"I am excited to be working with ChAPS for our Autism's got Talent Roadshow.*

"I am proud of being a patron to this wonderful charity and feel honoured to be celebrating ten years with what will be a night to remember!"

The event takes place at The Brindley in Runcorn, and anyone on the autism spectrum (whether diagnosed or not) is in with a chance of featuring in the performance.

Those interested are asked to submit a video clip and short biography to Emily at warrington@cheshireautism. org.uk before February 28th.

As with all charities, funding is essential for ChAPS to be able to continue to provide the range of activities which they do.

Receiving a second National Lottery grant for a Sustainability Project, which will last for five years, is a "game changer" as it secures the charity's future without leaving it reliant on successfully securing future grants.

This project has allowed ChAPS to offer accredited Professional Training with

Open Awards including workshops such as 'Introduction to Autism' being very well received.

The Open Awards carry a mix of theory, practical advice and workshops, with 'Pathological Demand Avoidance' another to have been completed, and others such as 'Working with autistic adults' planned for the future.

The second initiative of this project is Learning 4 Life, a specialist-led social care provision for adults on the autism spectrum, again whether they have been diagnosed or not.

The initial project in Northwich has enjoyed "remarkable engagement" and will soon be expanded to include Widnes and Chester, with anyone interested encouraged to contact ChAPS.

Funding from clinical commissioning groups is also allowing ChAPS to run further parent training workshops whilst NHS England are supporting child and adult mindfulness courses, Lego and Play Therapy across the county.

Also , the experience and improvements seen to the families whom ChAPS have taken on summer camping excursions in North Wales has prompted the ambition to fund a campsite, with anyone knowing any suitable land available in Cheshire also invited to contact the charity.

The charity's range of services continue, including putting on daytime activities such as Animal interaction, Craft and Art and ice-skating for the growing number of children who are being home-educated.

Funding provided for British Science Week will see ChAPS providing STEM activities both to home educators and their general membership at the charity's Kidz and Youth Clubs.

ChAPS has offices in Runcorn and a

training room in Northwich, but are also keen to expand further.

"As the charity has grown and the staffing accordingly, we are now looking for premises for an Autism Centre," adds Jo.

"We run 90 activities every month and a lot of the intensive work that we do needs premises to be available both in the daytime and evening.

"It is the next step for our small charity and we are super-excited to be in this position but again, we would love to hear from anyone who knows of any buildings that might be suitable in the mid- Cheshire area.

"The future is certainly bright and exciting!"



When you first see the HR-V you will start to think 'is it a coupe or an SUV'. That's exactly what I thought when It arrived on my driveway, but I have been told that Honda wanted it to have the lines of a coupe, but also the robustness of an SUV and to be honest they seem to have pulled that off rather well and now the HR-V is one of the better-looking SUV's currently on the market.

Power and Efficiency:

The 1.5 Litre i-VTEC has130PS and155Nm of torque which is good and all thanks to Honda doing such a wonderful job of getting the best out of this fantastic little petrol engine that is so far, this year, one of the better ones I have come across for its size. I am also happy to report that

the engine feels very refined and has bags of torque available when you need it most which makes motorway driving easy, quiet and unfussy.

The HR-V will also return a combined 42.8 MPG if driven with a very light right foot – and the emissions came in at a very respectable 130 g/km. Top speed will also stop at around 119mph and 0-62 will come in at around10.2 seconds.

On the road:

The HR-V does not feel heavy or cumbersome at all - and you can sense that Honda has put in a lot of effort in setting up the suspension and chassis to help deal with the many different surfaces the HR-V will come across in its lifetimebe that the morning school run or that camping trip away with the family.

Design & Technology:

The interior is of a good standard and its controls are well set out and all the dials are clear. I did not like the driver's seat as I found I just couldn't get the seating position perfect for me – but then I am quite fussy. Space inside is also good – better than most, and you could easily fit in a very large amount of luggage.

Plus – everything inside the HR-V feels well put together because it's a Honda and you know it will last till the end of time. Passenger legroom is also fine, as is the boot space with a seat up capacity of (431 litres) and seats folded flat capacity of (1456 litres).

Standard equipment on the S model includes; LED daytime running lights, Honda Connect with Garmin navigation, parking sensors, heated seats, LED headlights, smart keyless entry & start, rearview camera, brake assist, DAB radio with USB and Bluetooth connectivity, automatic climate control and cruise control with speed limiter. The list does not stop there either – you also get; magic seats, power windows, ISO fix points, alarm & immobilizer system, hill start assist and vehicle stability assist.

To sum up:

With three grades of walks offered most Sundays, plus midweek options, there's plenty of choice for anyone joining Chester Rambling and Hill Walking Club. We have 'C' grade rambles on the region's lower hillsides, 'B' walks which take in higher, more undulating routes, and 'A' walks for members who prefer to tackle something altogether more strenuous. With all walks, leaders will have planned the route carefully, using public rights of way or permissive paths, and always incorporating at least one gorgeous view to croon over. We'll pass through meadows, woods, maybe an area of parkland, possibly some open moorland, or along riversides, canal towpaths, or higher up amongst the clouds. For the 'A' group, mountainous crags or ridges are almost always included. Across any terrain, routes will be criss-crossed with fences, walls or hedges that define one man's territory from another, and this is where things can get interesting! Methods of crossing from one tract of land to the next can range from a simple gate to stiles made of wood, metal or stones....

In our experience, stiles come in a glorious array of shapes and formats. A basic version will be two wooden planks with a crossbar, easy enough to use unless it's wobbly, rotten, has bits missing, is festooned with barbed wire or submerged under thick vegetation. The same applies to ladder stiles. Taking a party of hikers over one of these is augranteed to slow the walk down - multiply the time taken for two of you to climb over by twelve or more, and you get my meaning. Farmers in the Yorkshire Dales are notorious for providing stone steps built into high walls, tricky if your head for heights is not brilliant, or you make the unwise decision to stand and admire the view from the top of said wall, like I did one day last summer. Yes, before you ask. I came a cropper, but managed to land feet first, somehow avoiding, by inches, both a freshly dropped cowpat and an outcrop of limestone. I lived to tell the tale, but the feat is not to be recommended

Squeeze stiles crop up in parts of the Peak District and are, quite literally, two upright limestone rocks set within a dry stone wall, with a gap of a few inches for walkers to squeeze between. These are ideal for skinny people with a tiny rucksack, but more of a challenge for plumper folk, or anyone carrying a large over-stuffed backpack. The secret is to stand sideways, inhale and go for it...

During a reconnoitring trip near Betws-y-Coed last summer, we were delighted to note that one previously decrepit stile had been replaced with a new, more robust version. On leading this walk for the Club two weeks later, we found that a tree had fallen, destroying both the new stile and several feet of fencing either side. OK, barrier down - you might think this meant an easier passage across, but it wasn't the case. Picking a route over and around a large prostrate conifer tree that's entangled with a splintered ladder stile and yards of wire fencing turned out to be a tricky manoeuvre for our group of 20 walkers, especially as there was a steep embankment on the other side with a gushing stream at its base.

In the hills of Flintshire, many stiles are being replaced with metal kissing gates – great for walking groups! Occasionally, however, a rickety wooden platform inserted into a pile of mossy stones still masquerades as a stile..... awkward at the best of times but requiring extra care in wet weather.

Hikers adopt all manner of ways of clambering over these obstacles. Whatever your stile, don't let anyone cramp it.


