# DATA BREACH

## DATA BREACHES - WHAT ARE THEY?

In 2014 the High Court held that the mis-use of private information was an actionable case in its own right. The case confirmed that there is no need to show damage has been caused for a person to make a claim under the Data Protection Act the distress of the information being mis-used is enough.

In 2018 the GDPR regulations came into force which stated that any person who has suffered material (if you have lost money) or non-material damage (such as distress) as a result of an infringement of GDPR has a right to receive compensation from the data controller for damage suffered.

The level of compensation you will be awarded is based on a case by case basis and depends upon the impact the breach has had upon you and how serious the breach was.

You can complain to the Information Commissioners Office, however they cannot award you compensation for any breaches.

Typical claims would include were a GP practice or hospital send a confidential report or medical records to the wrong person. The correct person is then notified and as such can seek compensation for the breach. Other examples include larger companies being hacked or a member of staff selling peoples information on to others the victims would be entitled to compensation.



New award ranks Chester Zoo pub as one of the world's best





- The Oakfield at Chester Zoo has been ranked in the top 10% of world's restaurants by users of Tripadvisor

Chester Cathedral Community Cross unveiled





## EDGE Travel Worldwide Celebrates Fundraisers' Virtual Climb to Everest to Support Chester Zoo



When seven school girls heard that the zoo they loved was in trouble, they stepped up and challenged themselves to climb to the top of Mount Everest to help save Chester Zoo.

After being forced to close for almost three months because of the COVID-19 pandemic, the UK's largest charity zoo faced an uncertain future and was pushed to the absolute brink of survival.

Starting their ascent on 5 June 2020, the

girls reached 1942m by just day three, and

completed their challenge in only 16 days.

When the girls reached base camp at 5380m, they had a zoom call with the Founder of the brand EDGE Travel Worldwide, Dave Pickles, who has operated on Mount Everest since 1997 and runs summit expeditions to the top as well as other UK and international adventure trips. He spoke to the girls about what is was like to climb Everest for real and offered to take the girls and their parents on an unforgettable trip up Mount Snowdon in North Wales for free to Organiser and mum to Layla, Vicky Powell, said:



"When Layla heard that the zoo was in trouble, she really wanted to help. The girls were so excited when they had the idea to climb to the top of Everest by climbing their stairs at home, which is a huge challenge for seven children aged between six and nine. They were so passionate about their challenge, one girl even climbed her stairs 100 times on day one!

"The zoom call with Dave really spurred the girls on, he was so knowledgeable and gave the group some really interesting information about mountain climbing. We were so touched when he offered to take the girls up Snowdon to celebrate their achievement."

Founder of EDGE Travel Worldwide, Dave Pickles, said:

"Not only did the girls achieve an incredible goal but the fact they wanted to help such an important charity as Chester Zoo really did

inspire EDGE Travel Worldwide to give both the girls and Chester Zoo the opportunity summit the highest mountain in Wales and the second highest in Great Britain this Autumn - Snowdon. To see the Chester Zoo flag flying at the top and the girls achieve another incredible goal will simply be superb - we can't wait to organise the trip once the lockdown has been lifted."



Jamie Christon, Chief Operating Officer at Chester Zoo said:

"We can't hide from the fact that this crisis has pushed us, the UK's largest charity zoo, to our limits. Ensuring that every one of the 35,000 animals continued to receive the very best care and attention over time we have been closed, with very little money coming in and no access to the government's support fund, has been one of the biggest challenges that this great zoo has ever faced.

"Although we've now been able to reopen to the public, which has been vital for the zoo's financial survival, there is still a long way to go before we're fully back on track - there is no denying that there will still be some very challenging times ahead. That's why we're so grateful to our wonderful supporters who are still fundraising for us. "We've been truly overwhelmed by the kindness that we've been shown when times are hard for everyone, not just us. The financial damage we've suffered has left a deep scar and the road to a full recovery remains uncertain. But with our fantastic fundraisers' support and being able to safely welcome visitors back, we've some renewed hope that this great charity zoo has a future."

Vicky Powell added:

"Lockdown has been difficult for everyone to get through, but with the girls not being able to meet up and see each other, this challenge has really made them feel like they were doing something fun together. They showed real team work and really kept each other going, it definitely helped take their mind off everything that was going on at the time.

"We all absolutely love the zoo and the vital conservation work it does and are so happy to have been able to raise so much for them. The real celebration will be when we will all finally be together to go up Snowdon – it will be the first time that we've all seen each other since lockdown. I'm so proud of what the girls have achieved."



# Review by Tony

Keeping you motoring

#### Skoda CITIGOe iV SE L



This week I have been testing the Skoda CITIGOe and I'm happy to report right from the start it's a proper little mover. I have a natural dislike of vehicles with electric engines because petrol runs through my veins like blood - but I have to embrace the future, so why not start with something small and perfectly formed. Also, I have a VW UP! a car I love very much - so the CITIGOe was in my book just like driving my car - but much faster off the line truth be told.

Well. let's see how it fared in this weeks review.

#### **Power and Efficiency:**

The CITIGOe is fitted with an electric motor that has 61kW (83PS) of instant power. Until you drive an electric vehicle you just can't comprehend just how quickly it moves you about. Also, I'm sure you all want to know how far it will go on a single charge. Well, I managed 170miles which in my book is pretty good. Top speed will also stop at around 81mph and 0-62 will come in at around 12.3 seconds.

My test car was fitted with an array of fuel-saving features which helps you get more miles for vour charge. Let's be honest here - it's blistering fast for such a small car, and it's a blast at the traffic lights. It is also very very refined thanks to

its 'silent running'. Even the eco tyres were less noisy than I imagined them to be.

#### On the road:

The CITIGOe does not feel heavy or cumbersome at all - and you can sense that Skoda has put a lot of effort into setting up the suspension and chassis. The CITIGOe will also keep you and your passengers firmly in their seats thanks to a softer suspension setup that won't have you bouncing all over the place like a rubber ball. That's because smaller cars tend to bounce you all of the place, but the little CITIGOe was a real peach. I also liked how it cornered, and how it just glided across all the lumps and bumps in the road ahead, even when the road is full of potholes (like my road)

#### **Interior & Technology:**

The interior is of a good standard and its controls are well set out and all the dials are clear to read. The space inside is also good, better than most – but it's very basic. Don't get me wrong – basic is good. You can also easily fit four adults

comfortably on the inside. Plus – everything inside the CITIGOe feels very well put together thanks to the usual Skoda quality.

You also get lots of kit such as; 16" Scorpius black alloy wheels, ambient lighting, ESC, front & rear fog lights, electric front windows, head and side airbags for the front seat, lane assist, LED daytime running lights, radio Swing with DAB & six speakers, rain & light sensor, remote control locking with SAFE function & tyre pressure monitoring system. This is just a small amount of what you will find. The interior is also funky and the seats even as basic as they look are really comfy.

#### To sum up:

A great buy for your first electric small car – If you are searching for one of the best small electric vehicles on the road at the moment – then the Skoda CITIGOe is a real contender.

Top Autumn tips to prepare your garden for Winter Your crops have been harvested, and the exuberant clearing away the decaying vegetation of the

Your crops have been harvested, and the exuberant summer colour has faded from your borders – but don't be fooled into thinking that it's all over until next spring. Autumn is a busy time in the garden,

clearing away the decaying vegetation of the summer and preparing the garden for the cold winter months ahead. Let the big clear up begin!



#### Spring clean your greenhouse in autumn

Cleaning the inside and outside of the greenhouse makes sense to help reduce overwintering pests and diseases. Remove the plants before sweeping out any plant debris. Disinfect the greenhouse paths and staging, and the inside of the glass too. Use a hot solution of garden disinfectant such as Jeyes Fluid. You will need to ventilate your greenhouse well over the next couple of days to dry it thoroughly.

Throughout the quiet winter months make an effort to wash out pots and seed trays in preparation for the spring sowing and planting. Don't forget that you can still sow plenty of vegetables to grow in winter. Click here to take a look at our 'Top 10 vegetables to grow over winter' article.

#### **Tidy Borders**

Dig up annuals and add them to the compost heap. You can replant your beds with winter bedding such as pansies, bellis daisies and wallflowers for a colourful display next spring.

Autumn provides an ideal opportunity to move poorly placed plants, and divide overcrowded perennials while the soil is still warm. Cut back faded perennials to 5cm above ground level, but don't be too tidy. They will also provide shelter for overwintering insects. Once your borders are clean and tidy, spread a thick layer of compost, bark chips or well rotted manure across them. Don't worry about digging it in - let the worms do the hard work for you.



#### Lawn maintenance

If your lawn looks slightly worse for wear then autumn is the perfect time to revitalise it. Remove thatch (old grass clippings) and moss using a spring tined rake and add it to the compost heap. If you have large amounts of moss then you may want to use a moss killer first. In areas that receive a lot of wear (such as paths and play areas) the soil can become compacted. Improve drainage and aeration by making deep holes with the prongs of a garden fork every 10cm across the entire area.

A sandy top dressing can be brushed in afterwards, followed by an application of autumn lawn feed to prepare your lawn for the cold winter months.

#### Plant evergreens

Evergreens form the backbone of the garden, providing structure and year round interest, so the more evergreens in your garden, the better it will look in winter! With warm soil and cooler conditions, autumn is the perfect time to fill those gaps in your borders. Sarcococca and Daphne will bring glossy green leaves and beautifully fragrant flowers in the depths of winter while the rest of your garden is dormant. For an elegant larger shrub try spring flowering Camellias or Fatsia for its large architectural foliage.

For a more formal look, why not invest in some box or yew topiary. Lonicera nitida, Bay and Holly can also be clipped into formal shapes and make excellent evergreen hedges too.





During stressful times, it's always good to escape the toils and challenges of life and head for the hills. No matter what the week has thrown at you, getting out for a good long hike at the weekend is the perfect way to blow away the cobwebs, de-stress and get yourself back on track. After one particularly harrowing week recently, we decided to make the most of the good weather, dig out boots, rucksacks and OS map and point the car in the direction of Llangollen.

I'd worked out a potential 9-mile circular route that included familiar footpaths and a few lesser known ones. Starting at the edge of Llangollen, we set off northwards along the canal towpath, soon passing over the point where the Eglwysea River ioins forces with its mightier big sister, the Dee, Further on is the popular Horseshoe Falls, but we turned off before then onto a footpath leading onto the lower slopes of Coed Hyrddyn, aka Velvet Hill, This gentle undulating path offers views of Castell Dinas Bran, Valle Crucis Abbey and the partially wooded escarpment of Fron Fawr. Our route crossed the Eglwseg River to link up with the Clwydian Way, following a track above the river as far as the tiny hamlet of Eglwyseg. Here we left both the river and the Clwydian Way to tackle the only notable climb of the day - a steady ascent of roughly 70 metres (230ft). This is one of those inclines that looks fairly innocuous from the bottom, but before vou're halfway up, unless vou're super fit, you puff and pant like an old war horse. Some folk deal with upward sloas by plodding staunchly on, regardless. A few can even conduct a conversation whilst plodding. I'm not one of these people so if, when going uphill, you have to stop and start several times to get your breath, you're in good company!

Completing this ascent had two benefits. One is that we stopped for lunch at the top; a well-earned rest was in order, the views were fabulous, and cheese and pickle butties were clamouring for attention from inside our rucksacks. The other good thing was that we knew there'd be hardly any more climbing to come on this particular route. Leaders often produce this comment on a walk and we who know better will follow this with 'Yeah, right. We've heard that before!'

In all honesty, after lunch this was an easy walk. At this point we'd almost reached the Offas Dyke Path, with the majestic Eglwyseg Rocks above us, and the silhouetted ruins of Castell Dinas Bran soon coming into view. We parted company with

the Offas Dyke Path to descend into the lovely Dinbren Woods, where keen-eyed folk will spot my favourite Public Footpath sign growing out of a tree trunk. How long it's taken for the tree to grow round the metal sign is anyone's guess, but sadly, in decades to come, this amusing quirk will literally be swallowed up!

From here we re-joined the Clwydian Way, before 'dog-legging' south, once again passing Valle Crucis Abbey in the valley below. Back on the canal towpath, it was a short distance back to the car park at Llangollen.

We'd enjoyed a magnificent day in the sunshine, created a very useful new route for our winter walking programme, and the previous week's pressures had been temporarily consigned some place else. A foray in the countryside is hard to beat as a way of retrieving that feel-good factor and getting back on track.

# NEW CHARTER FOR OPEN SPACES



The Open Spaces Society(1), Britain's oldest national conservation body, calls for a better deal for open spaces. Today it launches its charter for open spaces [attached] and has written to Robert Jenrick, the Secretary of State for Housing, Communities and Local Government, and to all of England's planning authorities.

The society calls on government to introduce a national plan and standards for open spaces, and to place a duty on local authorities to ensure that everyone can enjoy good-quality, well-maintained and safe open space within 300 metres of their homes. It says that such spaces should be secured as part of development. Local Green Space(2) must offer greater protection than now, and the process for designating it must be improved.

The society urges planning authorities to adopt robust policies for the acquisition, management and protection of green spaces, to have a budget for them and to dedicate their green spaces as town or village green to ensure their protection.

It recommends communities to get involved in their local planning processes before land is allocated for development, to identify spaces which need protection and to form friends' groups to champion local spaces.


The society pledges to lobby government to secure open spaces and access to nature through the 25-year environment plan, the Agriculture and Environment Bills and the new Environmental Land Management Scheme. It will continue to advise its members on how to protect their open spaces.

In particular the society wants to see greater use of the opportunity to register land as a town or village green(3) as mitigation for development, and has asked each planning authority to consider voluntary registration of the land which it owns, and to encourage developers to do the same by making this a condition of planning permission. It has also asked the authorities to send examples of its policies and good practice

for open spaces, so that the society can create a dossier for green space, and spread the word.

Says Phil Wadey, the society's newly-elected chairman: 'During lockdown people have enjoyed their local spaces and paths as never before, and this use continues beyond the pandemic. We know there is a great disparity in the distribution and quality of open spaces, and that investment in these assets provides excellent value for money by improving people's health and well-being.

'We therefore call on government, local authorities and communities to work together to ensure that everyone has access to good-quality green space close to home. This is a vital element of the green recovery after the pandemic. We have made proposals as to how this can be achieved.'
