THE CORONATION CEREMONY: A View from the Past

As media fever grows around the upcoming Coronation of King Charles III on Saturday May 6th, the world will be glued to their TV screens, phones, iPads or other preferred devices/Social media feeds, to follow this historic event.

But take a minute to sit back and reflect on how previous Coronations were viewed by the nation, before TV, the internet and Social media were ever in existence!

Before our late Queen Elizabeth's Coronation in 1953 whet the appetite for live broacasting worldwide, the preceding 1937 Coronation saw TV very much in its infancy, with limited coverage. The masses communicated very differently in 1937 and one of the main ways people learnt about events going on in the world around them was through the medium of Cigarette Cards.

These were sets of little cards with beautifully illustrated fronts, accompanied with information on the backs, which really were, in some cases, the only way that less well off people were educated.

The event on May 6th will see media companies vying for our attentions in many different ways, but renowned Royal historian Dr. Cyril Mazansky has come up with a very novel and different viewpoint that showcases how the day of the Coronation of 1937 was captured on such cards.

An exquisite 20 page booklet, "The Coronation Ceremony for King Charles III," gives today's viewers a peek back in time to how our ancestors in 1937 would have followed the ceremony!

The intention of the booklet is to bring the gentle hobby of Card Collecting (or Cartophilia to give it its grand sounding proper name!) to the attention of a younger audience and to share with them a view of the past through these lavishly coloured cards that were once everyday items for the public over 80 years ago. Hopefully the booklet will spark people's curiosity enough for them to explore further the colourful and enthralling world of Card Collecting.

Conference paves the way for international culture changes

On 17 March, over 270 delegates came together for the 2023 clinical conference of the Centre for Autism, Neuro-Developmental Disorders, and Intellectual Disability (CANDDID). The programme enabled national and international experts talk about Autism and Neurodevelopmental Conditions: advances in our understanding and management.

CANDDID, based in Chester, and hosted by Cheshire and Wirral Partnership NHS Foundation Trust (CWP) brings together, education, training and research in the fields of neurodevelopmental disorders and intellectual disabilities.

Keynote speeches and seminars covered a wide range of topics, such as avoidant/restrictive food intake disorder and autistic children, diagnostic and treatment pitfalls in adult ADHD management, and principles for prescribing in autistic people.

The conference highlighted the importance of a multi-disciplinary approach to understanding and managing autism and neurodevelopmental conditions, with the experiences of people and families at the heart of care and treatment.

CANDDID were also delighted to welcome international speakers Dr. Oddbjørn Hove, PhD, Dr. Hanne Marit Bjørgass, MD, PhD, and Anette Våga Ball, who presented on the innovative topic of "MindMe: Using Cognitive Accessibility Features to Empower Digital Self-Report in Children and Young People with Cognitive Challenges."

The conference provided delegates with valuable insights into the latest advances in understanding and managing autism and neurodevelopmental disorders, fostering collaboration and knowledge-sharing among professionals in the field. Experts with experience were encouraged and supported to attend the conference.

Michaela Hollins from Merseyside Autistic Adults commented that it was "very interesting... there's always something to learn". Dr Hanne Marit Bjorgass MD, PHD, from Stavanger University Hospital said: "This is my first CANDDID conference and I feel I've learnt so much, it's been really good to speak to people with a lot of practical experience. I'm taking a lot of knowledge back home and hope to put it into practice."

Dr Catriona Stewart, OBE, FRSA, said: "I've had interesting conversations and made contacts with people I'm hoping to stay in touch with. I've enjoyed it a lot more than I expected to, and I feel very encouraged about the work that's going on, the attitude, the passion and the commitment."

Professor Sujeet Jaydeokar, Chair of CANDDID, said: "Thank you to everyone who attended this year's conference. I hope its provided delegates with valuable knowledge and expertise, allowing them to share best practice that will improve outcomes both nationally and internationally for individuals with neurodevelopmental disorders and intellectual disabilities."

Tim Welch, Chief Executive of CWP said: "Thank you to all of the fantastic speakers and delegates who joined us at this year's conference. It's important we continue to emphasise the significance of continued learning and collaboration in the field of neurodevelopmental disorders and intellectual disabilities."

MONTH Z HISTORY

This feature each month will give interesting facts from years gone by. See what you remember that happened in your lifetime.

THIS DAY IN HISTORY FOR THE MONTH OF MAY

1st May 1960

An American U-2 spy plane flying at 60,000 feet was shot down over Sverdlovsk in central Russia on the eve of a summit meeting between President Dwight D. Eisenhower: and Soviet Russia's Premier Nikita Khrushchev.

The sensational incident caused a cancellation of the meeting and heightened existing Cold War tensions. The pilot, CIA agent Francis Gary Powers, survived the crash, and was tried, convicted and sentenced to 10 years in prison by a Russian court.

Two years later he was released to America in exchange for an imprisoned Soviet spy. On his return to America, Powers encountered a hostile public which apparently believed he should not have allowed himself to be captured alive.

He died in a helicopter crash in 1977.

13th May 1981

Pope John Paul II was shot twice at close range while riding in an open automobile in St. Peter's Square in Rome. Two other persons were also wounded.

An escaped terrorist, already under sentence of death for the murder of a Turkish journalist, was immediately arrested and was later convicted of attempted murder.

The Pope recovered and later held a private meeting with the would-be assassin and then publicly forgave him.

28th May 1961

Amnesty International was founded by London lawyer Peter Berenson.

He read about the arrest of a group of students in Portugal then launched a one-year campaign to free them called Appeal for Amnesty.

Today Amnesty International has over a million members in 150 countries working to free prisoners of conscience, stop torture and the death penalty, and guarantee human rights for women.

30th May 1967

On this day, a still relatively unknown Even Knievel made one of this earliest jumps, over 16 parked cars placed side by side at the Ascot Speedway in Gardena, CA. He took off and landed safely on the opposite ramp, which naturally encouraged him to perform a more challenging and dangerous stunt next.

There will likely never be another daredevil like Evel Knievel; the insurers simply would not allow it. He not only made motorcycle jumps, but also failed them. And when he failed and fell, he invariably broke bones — 433 of them, a Guinness record, over the course of his career. But he couldn't be stopped.

Evel never cared for rules and restrictions, not since his youthful days as a highschool dropout. He wanted to keep pushing the limits of what was possible, even if that was impossible.

In one of his last interviews with Maxin Magazine he said:

You can't ask a guy like me why I performed. I really wanted to fly through the air. I was a daredevil, a performer. I loved the thrill, the money, the whole macho thing. All those things made me Evel Knievel. Sure, I was scared. You gotta be an ass not to be scared. But I beat the hell out of death. [...] You're in the air for four seconds, you're part of the machine, and then if you make a mistake midair, you say to yourself, "Oh, boy. I'm gonna crash," and there's nothing you can do to stop it, not at all."

What's Appening at Chester Zoo.

Twin tiger cubs emerge from their den at Chester Zoo



Two critically endangered female Sumatran tiger cubs emerge from their den at Chester Zoo for the very first time.

Chester Zoo has captured footage of two rare Sumatran tiger cubs emerging from their den for the first time.

The cubs were born in January but have only now started to venture out and explore the outside world.

Conservationists caught on camera the adorable moment the cubs enjoyed some playful 'rough and tumble' under the watchful eye of proud mum Kasarna.

Carnivore experts at the zoo have revealed both cubs to be female and have named the twins Alif, a popular name in Indonesia, and Raya after Mount Raya in Sumatra.

Sumatran tigers are found only in patches of forest on the Indonesian island of Sumatra where just 350 remain. The species is listed as critically endangered in the wild by the world's authority on the state of the nature, The International Union for the Conservation of Nature (IUCN). Habitat loss, hunting pressures and humanwildlife conflict are pushing the big cats closer to extinction.

Chester Zoo is part of an international conservation breeding programme to protect the species, aimed at boosting numbers and safeguarding its future on the planet.



Dayna Thain, Carnivore Keeper at Chester Zoo, said:

"These majestic animals are hanging on to survival by a thread in Sumatra. They're one of the world's rarest tiger subspecies and so to see these two cubs thriving here is absolutely wonderful. It's a real joy to get a glimpse of the cubs exploring and enjoying some playful rough and tumble together.

"The cubs are still a little shy and pop in and out of the den with mum Kasarna, but it's going to be a real privilege to watch as they grow in confidence and their feisty personalities really start to show through. Recently, we discovered them both to be female and have named them Alif and Raya.

"Crucially, with so few Sumatran tigers left on the planet, Kasarna's girls are vitally important additions to the conservation breeding programme which is working tirelessly to prevent the species from becoming extinct."

An increasing human population has seen more than 90% of the Sumatran tiger habitat wiped out, bringing the big cats into close conflict with villagers, farmers and livestock.

The species is also heavily poached for its skin, bones and canine teeth, which are sold illegally in traditional Asian medicine markets.

The zoo's conservationists are fighting illegal poaching and helping to mitigate conflict between humans and tigers in India and Nepal, to further improve the future for another tiger subspecies, the Bengal tiger.

Commissioner's support for cyber victims



Cheshire's Police & Crime Commissioner, John Dwyer, has funded an extra post at a national charity to work with the police and support victims of crimes like cyber-stalking in the county.

Founded five years ago, The Cyber Helpline supports victims of online crime by connecting them to volunteer IT and cyber security experts. Volunteers are fully vetted and trained, and come from a range of backgrounds including graduates from computer science or cyber security degrees, or cyber security professionals.

Funding from the Commissioner has enabled the recruitment of a dedicated Helpline Responder who will work with Cheshire Constabulary's Harm Reduction Unit (HRU). The HRU will be able to refer victims who are experiencing significant levels of cyber-related stalking, and the responder will in turn work alongside the independent support provided by the HRU's Specialist Victim's Advocates.

The responder will also be able to assist police during the evidence-gathering process, and stay in touch with victims to help ease them back into the online world.

Police and Crime Commissioner, John Dwyer, said: "I'm really pleased to be able to fund this extra post at the Cyber Helpline, which will make a difference for victims of cyber-related stalking and other crimes here in Cheshire.

"As more of our day to day lives are moving online, it's vital that the police tap into specialist knowledge that can support victims and help bring offenders to justice."

Charlotte Hooper, Helpline Manager & Director at The Cyber Helpline said: "The Cyber Helpline is delighted to be supporting Cheshire's Harm Reduction Unit to provide more holistic support to victims of cybercrime, at a time where technology is used to enable different types of crime and harm these partnerships are vital. We welcome the funding to support cases from the Harm Reduction Unit which allows us to support more victims of cybercrime."

The work of Cheshire's HRU was featured in a BBC documentary about how stalking is tackled across the country, and the Constabulary has also been praised for its use of Stalking Protection Orders to protect victims.

Detective Sergeant Dave Thomason from the Harm Reduction Unit said: "The Harm Reduction Unit rarely encounters a case of stalking where there isn't some degree of cyber-enabled abuse. Seemingly benign technology is often used by stalkers to monitor, surveil and control their victims, which can leave them terrified when out and about but also in their own homes.

"We're really excited to have this partnership with the Cyber Helpline so victims our advocates are already supporting can now get specialist support from industry leading experts. This will help secure evidence to bring stalkers to justice as well as keeping victims even safer."

John Dwyer added: "I'm aware of a recent storyline on a soap where the way a report of stalking was handled couldn't be further from the truth when it comes to what happens here in Cheshire.

"If you are a victim of stalking, be it cyber-related or otherwise, don't hesitate to let the police know. The support systems are there to protect you and help you to recover."






Teamwork: Appreciating the Contribution of Others

The Social One

Author - Marios Mantzos

This football season(2022-23) has been a tremendous challenge for many Premier League managers since, for an increasing number of clubs, the role of manager/head coach has become a "revolving door". Even in April, as the season nears its final stages, the panic signs of "under achievement" and "relegation" have signalled the exit door for Potter (Chelsea), Rogers (Leicester City) and Vieira (Crystal Palace). "Security" and "patience" are, for many clubs, not part of the job description. As a neutral observer, I wondered how Jurgen Klopp had managed to "escape" being part of the "turmoil" and facing the guillotine for under achievement.



In contrast with the "hire and fire" strategies adopted by many other clubs, Liverpool have stood by the personal skills of Klopp which have resulted in previous success, despite the current dip in levels of performance. In a compelling and insightful indepth analysis of Jurgen Klopp's personal skills and motivational leadership qualities, Marios Mantzos "The Social One", unravels for the reader the qualities that Klopp displays. In a well researched text the author highlights the "raison d'etre" which justify labelling Jurgen Klopp as the "top human resources manager in modern sports history" and a "perfect fit for Liverpool".

Supporters of Liverpool will need no reminding of the demise of Liverpool as a leading Premier team following winning the championship in 1990 and Kenny Dalglish's resignation in February 1991. The following 25 years were "barren in terms of success". Managers such as Graeme Souness, Roy Evans, Gerard Houllier, Rafa Benitez, Roy Hodgson, Kenny Dalglish and Brendan Rogers could not stem the decline into "relative obscurity". The inability to meet the challenge of other teams, in particular Manchester United, under the leadership of Sir Alex Ferguson, who dominated the success charts of the 1990s and early 2000s, was an "niggling" issue for supporters and the club's worldwide commercial enterprises.

Following the sacking of Brendan Rogers in October2015 the search was on for a "personality" who could re-ignite the "team" and generate the success necessary to satisfy the demands of the loyal supporters. The author details how Jurgen Klopp was considered to have the attributes to be the "new Shankly". He displayed as an outgoing individual with the skills to relate to and build partnerships with supporters and manage the team to "make them believe". The author highlights the "socialist model" for development and success. The key focus was based on nurturing and motivating the "current squad" to play better, in "his way" and as a group, rather than spending exorbitant sums of money on new players who did not fit into his "scheme for success".

Jurgen Klopp does not hide from his personal beliefs in terms of Christianity, LGBTQ+ and other issues such as poverty. For instance he is a member of the "Common Goal Family" of professional footballers, inspired by Juan Mata, whose members agree to give 1% of their annual salary to "people who really need it". As a manager Klopp has displayed the personal skills to connect with the fans and put them "first" in terms of their emotional concerns and desires, in the image of Bill Shankly, who made Liverpool FC unique in that it "welcomed everyone", regardless of race, social class or gender. I was particularly enamoured by Jurgen Klopp's statement "we have to entertain them, to make their lives better by forgetting their problems for 90 minutes" and having a topic of conversation in the days prior to, and, following the game. Undoubtedly the dreams of supporters were met in June 2019 when the team returned from Madrid as European Champions and crossed the City of Liverpool in an open topped bus. He has become a man "loved by the people of Liverpool" with the nickname "The Normal One" ...a Scouser in disguise!!

A key feature of the book is how Marios Mantzos promotes the personal insight and empathy of the reader regarding the personal skills of Klopp as a leader. A key element of his inter-personal style is his ability to enter into a "conversational process" to gain the rapport of mutual trust and support. This is evident when he highlights the importance of high quality personal attributes in addition to playing skills necessary to play for Liverpool. Evidence shows that Klopp has a huge influence on individuals, both as footballers and human beings by creating a "Helping Syndrome" based on trust and accessibility by being "always there". Readers will gain considerably from the chapter on "Never give Up". As a preface, the author highlights a quote from Nelson Mandela " I never lose, I either win or learn". This epitomises the "mindset" Klopp has built within the Liverpool squad in terms of dealing with a "bad psychological moment" He emphasises that "nothing is over"..... we still have a "chance to comeback".

Readers who are currently managers or aspiring leaders in sport, industry or schools/ colleges will gain considerably from the chapter on "Making Stars", where **the author unravels Klopp's skills in creating the "unity of the team" by creating in the mould of Shankly, not only a bond with supporters but recognising, appreciating and acknowledging the role to the "team effort" of back room staff at all levels.** The section on "future managers" is full to overflowing on tips and strategies to be more personally effective and, in particular, gaining the skills to stimulate self drive and motivation in others by recognition of their contribution.


This is an outstanding insight into how the high level personal and managerial skills of Jurgen Klopp both in terms of generating "positive mindsets" of individuals and creating the "team effort" can be beneficial in other walks of life. Essential reading

Cheshire Murders and Misdemeanours

The tranquillity and beauty of life in rural Cheshire is enjoyed by many individuals and families as they "escape the pressures and bustle of working life" within the bordering cities of Liverpool and Manchester. However, rural life wasn't always a "peaceful haven". In a compelling and thought provoking book, "Cheshire Murders and Misdemeanours", Paul and Rose Hurley reveal the "dark side" of life in Cheshire during the 19th and early 20th centuries.



In contrast to present day affluence, Cheshire had many pockets of deprivation and rural poverty interlinked with "established wealth" and developing "income from enterprise". The thriving economy in the market towns of Macclesfield, Winsford, and Northwich linked to, the attraction of the City of Chester alongside the developing industrial centres for employment such as Warrington, Runcorn and Ellesmere Port generated considerable social change. Families who had been "trapped" in toiling long hours were moving from "rural poverty" to the towns in search of work. Unfortunately, social upheaval and breakdown of extended family support frequently resulted in social unrest and crimes, including murder.

The authors have collated a range of "true stories" which promote awareness for the reader of "life in the raw" for many in Cheshire. The authors bring "history alive" by highlighting the "savage", no nonsense approach to imposing punishments and "justice". The authors give accounts of public flogging, torture, transportation to the virgin lands of Australia and the Americas and in a number of cases, execution. Chapter 1, Crimes and their Sentences gives graphic examples of death sentences "awarded" for crimes such as burglary. "1779 William Ellis for burglary, and William Loom, discharging a loaded pistol at Charles Warren of Congleton, executed at Boughton".

The stories of the crimes and sentences are visually "brought to life" with an excellent range of photographs appertaining to key areas of significance. The high standard of overall presentation highlight for the reader of the importance of "awareness of history around us". In addition, the stories highlight the key social relevance of issues of poverty, people in "service" to the more affluent and men moving between workhouses. The recounting of stories such as "A Heinous Murder in Hyde", "Wife Abuse leads to Murder" and "Outrage in Over" are particularly relevant in terms of the current debates on social justice, lighter sentencing, children in care and parole for offenders.

The authors are to be congratulated on bringing key aspects of social behaviour linked to the historical impact of crime and punishment within a rural area in an outstanding coherent style which "brings the past to life". Well worth reading.





Our leaders, though adept at arranging walk routes, have yet to master the skills of weather governance, and those promised views of Criccieth Castle and the Rhinogs eluded us, thanks to low clouds that refused to budge all day.

Day 2 was altogether more promising. Our 9-mile B walk from Dyffryn Ardudwy took us inland up along an old drovers track. Pausing now and again, we turned to admire the views across the magnificent beaches and dunes at Morfa Harlech. Across the bay, the pale grey arm of the Llyn Peninsula could be picked out on the horizon.

Climbing slowly higher onto the moors, the hill tops became hidden in cloud. Occasionally the sun threaded its way through, producing some beautiful light effects and enhancing the distant views with its cheery rays. We were 300 metres above sea level at our highest point, up on the open moorland, surrounded by mountains. It's hard to imagine that this was once the 'main road' for packhorses and drovers travelling between Harlech and London! There's a wilderness feel here, and we encountered few other hikers, even after joining the well-signposted Ardudwy Way.

Roughly half-way through the walk, at Pont Sgethin, we stopped for our lunch break. This old packhorse bridge provides a crossing over the Afon Ysgethin, which traverses a wild and windswept plateau to meet the sea near Tal-y-bont. Here, we changed course, and were now on the opposite side of the valley heading back towards the shoreline. As the waters of Llyn Erddyn appeared to our left, the track began its slow descent to Pont Fadog. Having spent much of this hike on moorland, the environment suddenly changed as we entered the trees at Coed Cors-y-gedol. With its mossy stone walls and the river thundering past us, these woods almost had a rain forest feel to them! From here it was a short distance along field paths back to our starting point at Dyffryn Ardudwy.

If you fancy discovering new walks in Cheshire, North Wales and beyond, then joining a hiking group with experienced leaders could be the way to go! We have a choice of 2 - 3 grades of walks most Sundays: C's can be up to around 1,000ft of ascent, B's up to 2,000ft, and A grade walks tackle the higher crags, usually in Snowdonia. We are also out every other Wednesday for a hike of 8 - 9 miles, and our Tuesday evening walks kick off in May.

We are a very friendly group and new members are always warmly welcomed. Whatever your walking ability, if you love the outdoors and fancy meeting likeminded folk, dig out your boots and join us!
