#### LAUNDRY-LOVING **PUP RUBY** SWALLOWS SOCK



A laundry-loving pup who swallowed a size 11 men's sock had a lucky escape after a vet managed to remove it - by pulling it out the other end.

Ruby, the five-month-old Welsh Springer Spaniel was violently sick after eating the garment, unbeknownst to her owner, Kate Malyon.

She was taken to Firs Veterinary Surgery in Kelsall and kept in for observations.

It was there the curious canine's antics were finally revealed after vet, Fiona Wall managed to remove a men's size 11 grey sock from the other end.

Kate said: "We have an extra room downstairs which is joined onto our garage and is used as a laundry/computer room.

"The door must have been left ajar and Ruby must've decided to have a little explore and swallowed one of the socks.

"It wasn't until the day after that I took her to the vets for a routine puppy appointment and happened to mention that Ruby had been sick in the car. which was unusual.

"One of the veterinary nurses asked if Ruby could've eaten something that didn't agree with her because she has done so in the past, and I didn't think she had.

"I was told to keep an eye on her and when I took her home, she was sick five more times overnight."

Kate, who lives in Tarporley, took Ruby back to the vets where Fiona established that she was dehydrated and needed to be put onto a drip.

The mum-of-three added: "Ruby was in a bad way, she wasn't eating, was really lethargic and could barely stand up.

"It was pretty horrendous not knowing what she could've eaten or what was wrong."

But thanks to Fiona and her team, it wasn't long before they got to the bottom of the problem.

The vet of 20 years works for the Kelsall practice which is run by Willows Veterinary Group.

Willows Veterinary Group offers a wealth of knowledge and expertise through a network of 25 small animal practices, a referral veterinary hospital, two equine centres and a seven-office farm practice, located across Cheshire and into Greater Manchester, North Wales, the Wirral and Staffordshire.

Fiona said: "Ruby has a history of eating foreign objects so when Kate brought her in for her routine puppy appointment with one of our veterinary nurses, Danielle, and mentioned she'd been sick, Danielle very sensibly told Kate to keep a close eye on her.

"Kate then brought her back in the next day saying she hadn't eaten and had been sick a lot overnight.

"I examined her tummy and could feel a long cylindrical mass in her small intestine and was concerned that it was a sock.

"I decided to try to see if we could get it to pass through her system without having to operate."

Ruby was put on a drip and given regular small meals.

An X-ray confirmed what Figna had suspected - that there was something blocking her intestine. She was given an enema to try and get her bowels moving.

Fiona said: "After a while, Ruby still hadn't been to the toilet and the plan was for her to have surgery the next day if the object had not worked its way through. But just as she was leaving, I decided to perform a final check for the day and it had finally worked its way down and I managed to pull a very long sock out of her bottom!

It was a great result for the end of the day and a very good outcome because we managed to avoid a huge operation without any complications. By the next day, Ruby was back to her normal self, she was a very happy dog again and Kate and I spoke about putting measures in place to ensure socks are locked away. But I think Ruby is just going to be one of those dogs you've got to watch!"

For Kate and her family, it is the first time they have had a puppy and mischievous Ruby is a much-loved part of the family.

## What's happening at Chester Zoo.

Birth of rare gibbon adds to record baby boom at Chester Zoo



- Endangered primate is the latest in an unprecedented surge of new animal arrivals at the zoo
- Stunning images show adorable ONE-DAY-OLD baby gibbon being cradled by mum Tilu
- Zoo hails its "biggest ever baby boom of mammals" on record

A rare baby gibbon is the latest addition to the "biggest baby boom of mammals" on record at Chester Zoo.

The silvery gibbon – a highly endangered primate – was born to mum Tilu (10) and dad Alven (19) on Wednesday (10 October) after a gestation of around 210 days.

The tiny pink-faced primate, which is much too small to be sexed and therefore

named, is among an unprecedented number of new arrivals at the zoo this year.

Other new additions include an Asian elephant calf, a black rhino calf, a sun bear cub, a greater one-horned rhino calf, an okapi and a baby West African chimpanzee.

A grand total of 733 mammals have been born so far in 2018, far exceeding the previous highest total of 566 in the same time period.

Mike Jordan, the zoo's Collections Director, said:

"This new baby gibbon has arrived hot on the heels of a whole host of other important births. Indeed over the last few months we've witnessed a huge baby boom at the zoo — including the most mammal births on record.

"Silvery gibbons, as with the vast majority of the species born recently, face threats to their survival in the wild. Importantly, each new arrival is helping us to raise awareness of the issues they face and the conservation work the zoo is doing to try and protect them, as well as being a valuable part of their respective conservation breeding programmes."

Experts have put the unprecedented period of conservation breeding success down to a range of factors including natural habitats, skilled staff, ever improving levels of care and increasing scientific knowledge of threatened species.

Conservationists estimate that fewer than 2,500 adult silvery gibbons remain in the wild, largely due to the large scale destruction of their forest home on the island of Java in Indonesia.

Eggplant Parmesan originated in Naples and spaghetti also became popular in Naples, try it with clams or mussels. Seafood is abundant and very good in Naples.

Naples gets quite hot in summer so spring and fall are probably the best times to visit. Since Naples is near the coast, it's more temperate in winter than interior cities of Italy.

As you are only in Naples for 1 whole day from the ship, enjoy the other great places such as your stay in Barcelona.



#### BEST-LAID GARDENING PLANS

As the nights draw in and the colder weather starts to descend, the thought of spending hours slaving away in the garden may not be as appealing as your favourite comfy chair and a cup of cocoa, but just a little bit of effort in these coming months could pay dividends in the spring.

Whether you like your flora bright and bold or delicate and serene, there are spring flowers to suit all tastes. As well as cultivating your very own visual symphony of colour, why not consider the wildlife in your area and plant a few treats for the butterflies and bees to enjoy?

To create a beautiful spring display in your garden next year, you need to begin planning and planting your bulbs now, according to the Horticultural Trade Association (HTA). If you are new to gardening, or simply unsure which flowers would be best for your garden, HTA member and bulb supplier, Taylor's Bulbs, have put some information together on the most popular bulbs to get your spring garden started.

#### HYACINTH

Hyacinths are a favourite because of their beautiful scent. They are pillars of delicious fragrance in many different colours. Try planting them near an entrance door or along a footpath, so you can enjoy their perfume.

#### **SNOWDROP**

Snowdrops signal the end of dark winter days, flowering in January and February when not much else is in bloom. They are an important source of nectar for early-emerging insects, particularly bees. They come in various heights and sizes.

#### CROCUS

Again, early flowering and available in many different colours, they are a great source of nectar for insects. Nothing looks better than a carpet of crocuses on a sunny February or March day, flowers fully open, showing their inner beauty. They are excellent for naturalising in grass or in a border.

#### **ALLIUM**

These are the stately globes of the bulb world. Large heads or small, they are all magnets for pollinating insects. Try planting purple and white together, or for something a bit different, try Nectaroscordum Siculum which is loved by bumble bees.

Other bulbs which are good for wildlife, particularly insects, are Eranthis Cilicica (Winter Aconites), all crocuses and snowdrops. These bulbs are particularly important as they flower early in the year when not much else is in bloom. On a sunny February day, you may see bumble bees searching for nectar. By planting a few of these bulbs, you can make a big difference to your local insect population.



#### VARCISSIIS

The range alone makes them a favourite. If you are careful with your selection, you can have narcissi in flower for up to five months of the year from January through to the beginning of May. They come in all different heights and colours, single-headed, multi-headed and fragrant. What more could you ask for?

#### **TULIP**

The elegant "ladies" of the bulb world, there is a tulip for every situation. Short or tall, single-headed, multi-headed and fragrant, pastel, primary and bold colours are all available.

#### Autoreview by Tony Yates

Keeping you motoring

Suzuki Vitara S 1.4 Boosterjet



The so-called Sports Utility Vehicle (SUV) or Crossover has been selling particularly well for a while now, thanks to buyers looking for a car that can tick all the boxes such as; space, practicability, economy and performance.

So, this week I have the rather good looking Suzuki Vitara S on test and I have to say, it's putting on a pretty good show in convincing me that maybe this is the one we really should all be looking at.

#### **Power and Efficiency**

The Vitara 'S' is powered by a four-cylinder direct injection turbocharged petrol engine that produces 140ps at 5500rpm and 220Nm of torque between 1500-4000rpm. 0 to 62 mph is dealt with in 10.2 seconds – moving onto a top speed of around 124 mph.

The official fuel economy figures from Suzuki are; 52.3 mpg (combined) with a CO2 rating of 127 g/km - although the best I could get was around 44mpg, but then I was not really trying to get near what Suzuki had said was possible.

#### On the Road

I like the way the Vitara handles – but I do feel the suspension needs to be a little stiffer - saying that, when the road gets twisty – it is more than capable of holding it's own thanks to the ALLGRIP 4-wheel drive system which in real terms performs well. You also get a lot of information through the steering as to what the wheels are doing on the surface of the road - which all helps in giving you a lot of confidence into the corners. If you do decide to take the Vitara onto a muddy field - or a slippery surface – you can be assured it will do its best to move you along at a reasonable pace, whilst keeping you on the straight and narrow.

#### **Safety and Technology**

My test car was fitted with suede seating and red interior accents which lifts even the most boring of interiors – Not that the inside is boring, but you do sense the Vitara was set out to be more practical that luxurious.

Space – well let's just say it has bags of it – along with a decent driving position and plenty of room in the back for three adults - even people who are 6ft plus would have no problem fitting in. The boot is pretty good too with max luggage capacity coming in around 710 litres.

Some of the standard features on the Vitara S include; LED daytime running lights, LED projector headlamps, ALLGRIP 4-wheel drive system, adaptive cruise control, DAB digital radio with 6 speakers, USB, Bluetooth and iPod, driver and passenger front, side and curtain airbags, ABS with EBD, Electronic Stability Program, Hill Hold Control and Hill Descent, front & rear parking sensors and rear parking camera.

#### To Sum Up

Suzuki have done a fantastic job here - and I expect the Vitara S to sell well in what is now a fast paced SUV market.



The money is a one-off discount on your electricity bill, paid between September and March. If you are on pension credit guarantee, you should automatically get it.
